Neighbourhood Watch.

 Reasons why a campaign for NHW could work at present. – Warning from the Mayor's Office of drastic cuts in the Met Police Budget could lead to cuts in Police Service. Even with cuts there is a £233million gap in police spending plans – cuts need to be made. Police stations to close (already done in Kingston) and cells to close. Kingston are having the cells up-dated and will cover other boroughs. Whilst Norbiton might keep their police and PCSO's other wards might not, leading to possible crime.

- 2 Meeting with Nicola Duffey gave encouragement to set up NHW. She has a large number of residents in Canbury involved in NHW and has offered help and guidance. She was an inspiration.
- 3 Meet and Greet. Nicola explained how Meet and Greet was used in Canbury. The idea is to wish people 'Good Morning/day/evening ' at Christmastime. The idea is to encourage 'Community Spirit'
- 4 Community Wardens. Tony Willis produced a report on the day of the meeting of his experience in the Borough of Camden. As there was not time to read and discuss the report, it will be an item for the next meeting. There will time to look into what is available in Kingston.
