	<ul> <li>Information <ul> <li>Housing is linked with many issues, for example Anti Social Behaviour, that cut across a variety of services ie Police</li> <li>70% of 'at risk' children in the borough live in social housing</li> <li>RM responsibilities – Rental/Multi Occupancy/Empty and Vacant/Tenant Complaints/Owner Occupiers</li> <li>Energy Efficient Measure – SAP Rating 0-100 Anything less than 50 represents possible Health concerns. 69 is average in RBK properties.</li> <li>Explanation of Housing Revenue Account (HRA) – Revenue from council rents; currently Central Gov takes 31p in £ and distributes around country, this will change 01/04/12.
