You said (priority)	Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) in general
Date set	June 2010
We did (action taken/going to be taken)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Tea mornings at Riverstone Court every Tuesday to speak to the residents and staff. We give advice and presentations about bogus callers and also offer advice about personal safety.• Kickz project which was held on the Cambridge Road Estate and at Kingsmedow, has now come to a close due to funding. The sessions are still running at Tolworth Goals.• SNT public engagements on the ward and monthly drop in sessions at Tadlow, which gives the local community a chance to meet the team and discuss any issues they may have regarding ASB.• Youth engagements held at Oxygen, Searchlight, Beavers and Scouts by PC Styles, PCSO Gregory and PCSO Brown. We provide talks to different age groups and get the groups involved in group work and explain our role as an SNT and how we are here to help and to explain more about ASB and how it can be prevented.• Getting involved at Piper Hall with the various projects they have running from there. We have been involved in the Refugee Action group and also attend meetings on the estate such a Crest and the

You said (priority)	Drug dealing and misuse
Date set	March 2010
We did (action taken/going to be taken)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working with Kingston Council to tackle drug use on the Cambridge Estate and Cambridge Gardens. • We attend community engagements at St Peters church for the Big Feast which is held every Wednesday. They take part in a bible reading session, and have a variety of speakers in to discuss how they have overcome their addiction. They are given food and all sit down as a group and discuss any issues they have and are provided with advice and support. • Gaining intelligence from local residents and businesses which can help us action drug warrants and patrol areas where drugs are being used or sold. • Single patrol by officers to identify any drug hot spots. These areas are patrolled, resulting in people being stopped and searched and appropriate action being taken. • If people are caught with a small amount of cannabis they are issued with a cannabis warning and reported for the crime. • Numerous drug warrants executed by the team, which have been successful. These have lead to arrests, court appearances and eviction from their flats.
